Mr. Ward mentioned that most of the jobs in US are created by small businesses rather than big corporate houses. So these small companies and start-ups are the key drivers of innovation and new growth. Swami Vedantitananda spoke of the key challenges in developing skills to generate employment and entrepreneurship particularly focusing on problems linked to setting up ITs in places which are remote and not connected with the industries. Addressing the gathering, Fr. Joseph said, "There is a mismatch between supply and demand of the skilled people. Vocational training is fulle without gathering, Pr.
