

Welcome Message – Fr. George Mathew, Executive Director, Don Bosco Tech Society



Dear Friends,

It is a pleasure to welcome you to the first edition of SkillSpark our bi-annual newsletter capturing the milestones and momentum of Don Bosco Tech Society.

As we reflect on the past months, we take pride in having successfully celebrated Skill Connect 25, our nationwide campaign that united alumni, trainees, staff, and partners across 90 centres. The campaign culminated on World Youth Skills Day in July, where centres across India showcased inspiring success stories, alumni engagements, demonstrations and community outreach events. The participation and enthusiasm reaffirmed our belief that sustainable pathways to employment are built through strong networks, mentorship and community leadership.

The first half of the year has brought several encouraging developments. Our Hospitality Training Program in Meghalaya, implemented in partnership with the Meghalaya Skill Development Society, empowered 135 young people and achieved an impressive 84% placement rate across India. We also welcomed a new collaboration with the SBI Foundation, opening opportunities for young learners in Solar PV Installation and Drone Manufacturing—sectors shaping India's green and future-ready economy.

A major milestone has been the onboarding of Don Bosco Tech Society as a partner under the VISTA Program (Vocational Integration and Skill Training in Assam) supported by Tata Trusts. Through this initiative, and in collaboration with the Salesians of Guwahati and Dimapur, we are delivering skill training to youth aged 18–30 across centres in Golaghat, Rangajan, Diphu, Kargauli, Maligaon, Bapetta Road and Amguri. The program covers eight focused job roles—including Guest Service Associate, Beauty Therapy, Domestic Electric Solutions, CNC Operator, Senior Welder, Four-Wheeler Technician, AI—Data Quality Analyst, and Airline Cabin Crew. The program also introduces skilling for students from select Government and Don Bosco Schools, through domains such as Media & Entertainment, Electronics, STEM innovation, and home appliance repair. Supported by BOONFACE-enabled monitoring, due diligence, E-KYC, batch reviews, assessments, and placement tracking, VISTA strengthens our outreach and impact across Assam, ensuring structured training, industry exposure, and guided progression for every learner.

Across our network, teams have actively conducted regional review meetings, POSH awareness sessions, industrial visits, and youth motivation programmes, ensuring that our trainees receive holistic and empowering learning experiences.

As we pass the mid-year mark and look ahead, DB Tech @ 20 is now gathering significant momentum. The year 2026 will mark a major milestone—20 years of Don Bosco Tech Society's journey in youth empowerment and skill development. Preparations are underway to document our legacy, celebrate our alumni, strengthen partnerships, and honour the people and communities who helped shape our 20-year journey.

As we stand on the threshold of this important milestone, I express my deep appreciation to all our trainees, alumni, trainers, State and National Office teams, donors, partners, and well-wishers. Your support continues to guide our mission of building dignified and sustainable futures for India's youth.

Don Bosco Tech – Awards & Recognitions



Skill Development Leadership Award

In February 2025, Don Bosco Tech Society was honoured with the Skill Development Leadership Award at the 33rd World HRD Congress, held on February 17 at Taj Lands' End, Mumbai. The recognition celebrated nearly two decades of excellence in vocational education and sustainable youth development. The award acknowledged Don Bosco Tech's strong performance in educational quality, outreach, leadership in skilling, learner impact, and social impact. In FY 2024–25 alone, the organisation trained over 15,000 youth and enabled placements for more than 10,000.

The award was received by Fr. George Mathew, Executive Director, and highlights Don Bosco Tech's extensive skilling work across Tier 2 and Tier 3 regions, supported by robust corporate and government partnerships. The honour reinforces its mission to "Skill India, Transform Lives" and its role in advancing inclusive youth employability.

Kalimpong District Empanelment as Training Partner

In February 2025, Don Bosco Tech Society reached a key regional milestone with its empanelment as an official training partner by the Kalimpong District Administration under the Department of Technical Education, Training & Skill Development, Government of West Bengal. The event highlighted that 61 youth from the state have already secured jobs in Japan and Singapore, alongside the launch of a government financial support scheme offering a ₹50,000 stipend and a ₹3 lakh loan for selected candidates. The Don Bosco Tech Shillong team, along with 11 trainees, actively engaged in interactive sessions and networking with international delegates, gaining valuable insights into global career pathways in nursing, hospitality, and other sectors.

A dynamic 21st Century Life Skills session, aimed at preparing trainees for future-ready careers. Through practical insights and real-world examples, trainees gained a deeper understanding of industry expectations and career pathways. Skill Connect Campaign Culminates in National Youth Skills Day Celebrations

15 June – 15 July 2025 – Nationwide

The Skill Connect Campaign 2025 concluded with vibrant celebrations across Don Bosco Tech centres on World Youth Skills Day. Throughout the month, centres shared stories, videos, demos, and alumni features promoting the dignity of skills. Youth Skills Day saw placement talks, employer interactions, alumni sessions, cultural events, project displays, and community awareness drives. Trainers stressed digital readiness, soft skills, and lifelong learning, while alumni shared career journeys across key sectors. Centres also showcased posters, photos, and local achievements, reinforcing youth pride and the impact of vocational education. The campaign echoed Don Bosco Tech's message—skills as a pathway to empowerment and opportunity.

84% Placement Milestone Reached in Don Bosco Tech–MSSDS Hospitality Programme

24 June 2025 – Shillong & Mawkisiang, Meghalaya

Don Bosco Tech Society, in partnership with the Meghalaya State Skill Development Society (MSSDS), achieved an 84.4% placement rate through its hospitality skilling programme. In three months, 135 youth were trained—60 in F&B Service at Shillong and 75 in Housekeeping at Mawkisiang. Of these, 114 secured jobs in reputed hotels, restaurants, and resorts across India. The programme combined industry-focused classroom training with practical apprenticeships on customer service, hygiene, sanitation, inventory management, and eco-friendly practices. The few unplaced candidates declined offers for personal reasons, highlighting the strong employability of trainees and the success of this state–NGO collaboration in creating livelihood opportunities for Meghalaya's youth.



Empowering Technical and Vocational Education and Training through Industry–Institution Collaboration

24 June 2025 – Bangalore, Karnataka

Don Bosco Tech Society hosted a two-day programme aimed at strengthening Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) and enhancing ITI education standards through industry–institution collaboration. Key discussions focused on integrating Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) and Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) policies to ensure safer campuses, assessing ITI infrastructure needs, and finalising the TVET SOP and Handbook scheduled for launch in September 2025. Participants also gained insights into manpower demand in Germany and shared best practices across ITIs. A field visit to Festo India Pvt. Ltd., Hosur offered hands-on exposure to advanced automation, while strategic sessions by Rangsons Defence Systems, Mysore added industry perspective. The initiative reaffirmed Don Bosco Tech's commitment to building a future-ready skilled workforce.

Strategic Launch of VISTA Project Strengthens Skill Training in Assam

4 August 2025 — Guwahati, Assam

Don Bosco Tech Society, in collaboration with the Salesians of the Guwahati and Dimapur Provinces, convened a strategic meeting on 23 July 2025 at the Don Bosco Provincial House, Pan Bazar, Guwahati, to formally launch the Vocational Integration of Skill Training in Assam (VISTA) project. The meeting brought together key provincial leaders, centre representatives, and DB Tech officials to align vision and implementation across Lower and Upper Assam. The VISTA project aims to expand quality skill training to underserved youth, with a focus on NSQF-aligned training, centre readiness, staff recruitment, mobilization, and placement mechanisms. The discussions emphasized provincial ownership, continuity, and collective responsibility, while also exploring future CSR partnerships to strengthen impact and sustainability.

Impact Assessment Highlights Success of Mahindra Swabhimaan LMV Driving Project

13 August 2025 — Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh

An impact assessment of the Mahindra Swabhimaan Project was conducted on 12 August 2025 at Don Bosco Tech, Kanpur, to evaluate the outcomes of the free Light Motor Vehicle (LMV) Driving Training initiative. The assessment captured feedback from 60 trainees and alumni, through both physical and telephonic interactions, to understand the programme's effect on employability and socio-economic upliftment. The review was held in the presence of representatives from Don Bosco Tech, Mahindra Finance, and Blue Sky Assessment Agency. Special focus was placed on alumni now employed as cab and taxi drivers, highlighting the project's success in enabling sustainable livelihoods through skilled driving and licensing support.

POSH Awareness Training

May 31, 2025 — Online / National Office — Accenture conducted an organisation-wide POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) awareness session, aimed at reinforcing safe, gender-sensitive, and compliant workplace environments across all DB Tech centres. The session focused on legal guidelines, reporting mechanisms, preventive measures, and the shared responsibility of staff and students in maintaining respectful spaces. Trainers and coordinators actively participated, making the session an important step in strengthening institutional culture.



Employability Skills Training

Employability Skills Trainings supported by the Wadhwani Foundation at Don Bosco Skill Mission, Bangalore, across multiple dates including April 3–5 and November 10 focused on strengthening trainers' capacity to deliver impactful employability modules.

Facilitated by Ms. Swathi and Mr. Vinay, the sessions covered innovative teaching methods, student engagement, classroom management, and core employability skills such as communication, teamwork, and problem-solving, along with legal literacy.

Trainers gained practical tools to better guide youth toward meaningful employment, contributing to a stronger skilling ecosystem.



Performance & Leadership Workshop

28–30 August 2025 — Don Bosco Tech Society hosted a three-day residential Performance and Leadership Development Workshop at Don Bosco Skills Mission to strengthen organizational effectiveness. Facilitated pro bono by Luminary Learning Solutions, the workshop brought together National and State teams to set clear KPIs, improve performance measurement, and build accountability. Executive Director Fr. George Mathew shared his five-year vision and KPIs, guiding collaborative work on departmental KPIs and data dashboards. The workshop concluded with a commitment to refine KPIs over the next six months.

VISTA: Bridging Classrooms and Careers Through Skill Education in Assam

Don Bosco Tech, in partnership with Tata Trusts, has launched VISTA – Vocational Integration and Skill Training in Assam, a flagship initiative aimed at strengthening youth employability while advancing the vocationalisation of school education. The project has been sanctioned and is scheduled to commence shortly; programme performance will be featured in upcoming bulletins.

Supported by the Salesian Provinces of Guwahati and Dimapur and designed by DB Tech professionals, VISTA will train 3,570 underprivileged youth over three years across eight in-demand job roles in sectors including hospitality, wellness, aviation, IT & ITES, automobile, manufacturing, and electronics.

A key innovation of VISTA is the integration of vocational learning for Grades 6–11, covering Media & Entertainment, Electronics, and STEM/Innovation, enabling students to connect academic learning with practical application.

Implemented across multiple locations in Assam, VISTA aligns with the National Skill Development Mission, NEP 2020, and the vision of Viksit Bharat @2047, creating sustainable pathways from education to dignified employment and inclusive regional growth.



The Team View Point – The Evolving Landscape of Skilling in North India

Over the last three years at Don Bosco Tech, I have witnessed a remarkable shift in the aspirations and skilling choices of young people across North India. As skilling becomes more closely aligned with emerging technologies, AI-driven courses have gained significant traction—especially among boys from urban and semi-urban regions who are eager to explore advanced digital careers. Clients and industry partners, too, are increasingly requesting Sector Skill Council -certified, demand-driven courses that match their future workforce needs.

Regional differences continue to shape course preferences. In Jharkhand and Bihar, many young women opt for nursing, beauty, and caregiving courses to access stable livelihoods in larger cities, while boys in Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh prefer hard skills like mechanical trades, solar installation, and electrician courses that align with local demand. In Punjab, aspirations to work abroad drive strong interest in healthcare and allied courses.

Across regions, one truth remains constant: skill training transforms lives—enabling young people to build careers, uplift families, and move toward dignity, opportunity, and a better future. — **Pardeep Jindal, Regional Manager – North India**


Sooraj


Manisha


Synrem
